As we conclude another successful year of providing quality services, we reflect on how far we've come. It was only 8 years ago when we made the bold decision to transition a small, governmental agency known as the "Rape Crisis Center" into a nonprofit organization named STAR®. With only 2 staff members and a small budget, we took a lot of chances in establishing what would become a nationally recognized sexuals assault center.



For the first time since our launch in 2012, we have had a chance to maintain and celebrate all of the great work we have done. While our services and staff have grown significantly each year since 2012, this past year, our budget, staff, and number of clients served remained relatively the same as the previous year. While some may see this leveling off in a negative light, we view it as success. We have built an organization with the capacity to meet the needs of many survivors of sexual violence in the communities we serve. The first phase in our plan to end sexual violence is to meet the need, and though there's always more need for our services, our holistic services for sexual assault survivors meet their needs in unparalleled ways.

With this need initially met, we can go further. The roots of sexual violence are deeply embedded in our culture. Ending sexual violence is our long game, and as we step into this next phase, we will maintain our critical response and support services to survivors and move forward with a greater focus on the long-term process of creating institutional and social change.

HERE TO SERVE

Since our inception, STAR® has served thousands of survivors and families by offering a non-judgmental confidential source of support to help them move past the trauma of sexual assault. Today, STAR®'s services continue to expand as community needs grow. We provide confidential advocacy, counseling, and legal services to individuals and families affected by sexual trauma at no cost. We also provide services to the community in the form of outreach, education and training to help end sexual violence.

SURVIVOR SUPPORT

STAR® provides supportive services to survivors of sexual trauma to reduce their experience of trauma. Our advocacy, counseling and legal services are available to youth and adult survivors of sexual violence at no cost and are intended to assist survivors at any stage of their healing.

EDUCATION & TRAINING

STAR® offers a variety of community engagement programs to carry out our vision of building a healthy community free from oppression and sexual trauma. We partner with community organizations, criminal justice agencies, hospitals, places of worship, and schools to provide outreach and education. Workshop offerings are available for adults and youth in the communities we serve.

CONSULTING

For years, STAR® has earned a reputation of providing exceptional and award-winning services to survivors of sexual violence, as well as businesses and organizations. As a nonprofit, we provide confidential, nonjudgmental services to survivors of sexual trauma, and this year, we have begun to extend this approach to working with companies by assessing their unique needs and providing custom solutions to challenges.

With national attention focused on sexual harassment and assault in industries across the US, there is an opportunity within workplaces to more effectively mitigate employer risk and ensure the safety of employees. STAR® provides several consulting options available to help businesses and organizations thrive.

COORDINATED COMMUNITY RESPONSE

Part of STAR's® mission is to improve systems response to sexual assault, and that is exactly what our Central Louisiana branch is doing. Every quarter, local law enforcement officers attend Crisis Intervention Training (CIT), organized by an intervention team composed of mental health professionals and law enforcement agencies to create better procedures when faced with trauma on the job. Over the past 2 years, STAR® has been involved in CIT, educating law enforcement officers in the region on how to respond to people who are experiencing trauma.

In the spring of 2019, the Central Louisiana branch was also awarded funding to provide free workshops to community members. Thanks to the Junior League of Alexandria, over 100 individuals now have knowledge and skills to better support survivors of sexual assault.

TRUTH OUT LOUD

PARTNERSHIP WITH TALES OF THE COCKTAIL®

Tales of the Cocktail® is the world's premier cocktail festival. The festival welcomes thousands of bar and spirits industry leaders each year to New Orleans for a week of seminars, tastings, networking, and special events. In 2018, STAR® partnered with Tales of the Cocktail to develop anti-harassment policies and training for staff, volunteers, and participants to ensure a safe and welcoming space during the festival. In addition, STAR® provided resources and materials to those who attended the festival, and presented "Harassment and Hospitality Don't Mix," our sexual harassment prevention seminar aimed at restaurant and bar owners and employees.

COLLEGIATE PREVENTION ACTION



Over the past year, STAR® has worked with students at LSU to coordinate efforts to address sexual assault on campus through our CPAC. For the 2018 - 2019 school year, CPAC members engaged in discussions on the proposed Title IX regulations introduced by the Department of Education. After hosting a round-table discussion and creating a blog post and messaging explaining the

regulations, CPAC members worked together and submitted formal comments about their concerns. As a result of the concerns brought forth by CPAC members, LSU has deepened their partnership with STAR® by connecting with STAR® to respond to medical exams at the campus health center and inviting STAR® to provide training to their campus advocates on the neurobiology of trauma.

LEGISLATIVE SESSION

In the 2019 Legislative Session, STAR® was successful in working with legislators to pass bills to address issues involving child marriage, material witness warrants, climate surveys on college campuses, sexual harassment, and forensic medical examinations. We also worked to support bills our community partners introduced and passed related to domestic violence.

SEXUAL VIOLENCE includes rape, attempted rape, child sexual abuse and a wide range of actions loosely referred to as sexual assault. Each of these can occur in many different contexts-including among family members, intimate 3,244 partners, friends, acquaintances and strangers—which affect the dynamics of the violence, as well as the way in which trauma is experienced. At STAR®, we offer direct advocacy, hospital accompaniment,

counseling and legal services free of charge to anyone seeking to heal from sexual trauma. Over the past year, our dedicated staff and volunteers provided

services to 1,107 unique survivors and their loved ones across the Capital Area. Greater New Orleans, and Central Louisiana.
